

diverse	If a group or range of things is diverse, it is made up of a wide variety of things.			
stereotype	A stereotype is a fixed set of characteristics that a lot of people believe represent a particular type of person or thing.			Key Mountain: Kilimanjaro (5,895m high)
natural resources	Resources that exist or occur in nature and are not made or caused by people (e.g. wind, water, oil, metals).			Key Waterfall: Victoria Falls (Zambia)
GMT Greenwich Mean Time	The standard time in Great Britain which is used to calculate the time in the rest of the world.			Key Desert: Sahara (The largest in the world)
perception	Your perception of something is the way that you think about it or the impression you have of it.			Key Oceans / Seas: Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Mediterranean Sea, Red Sea
time zone	Time zones give specific areas on the Earth a time of day that is earlier or later than neighbouring time zones.			Key City: Cairo, Egypt (population of 15.6 million people)
savannah	Open grasslands, usually with scattered bushes or trees			
semi-arid	Characterized by little rainfall and scrubby vegetation			
production	The process of making or growing something in large amounts.			
vegetation	Plants, trees, and flowers			
plateau	A large area of high and fairly flat land.
